Clan MacGregor Aids in the Fight Against Childhood Cancer

Congtime SST member and past Vice President Scott MacGregor was recently recognized as a Knight of the Bald Table by the St. Baldrick's Foundation for his many years of participation as a "shavee" in their annual fundraising efforts. Over the years, Scott has raised over \$10,000 for the fight against childhood cancer. He participated again this year, with his daughters and grandchildren, and underwent the annual head shaving ritual on the morning of the St. Patrick's Day Parade on March 14.

"We've all been looking to this date since last year and collecting funds for a few months," explained Scott, "Many of you have graciously supported our cause. We thank you each for this support. All donations BIG and small count towards finding a cure for the different children's cancers.

"While the girls were not shaved bald they each gave at least ten inches to Locks-of-Love. Each of us boys were shaved as bald as they could legally go. Our heads are now lighter and very much cooler. Little Emmy (granddaughter) is getting the biggest kick out of her new hair style.

"For those curious to know, to date for this year: I have raised \$695, Darcie and grandchildren: \$500, Jamie and grandsons: \$500. This was my 8th year of participation, 3rd year for my grandson WESS, 2nd year for grandsons Logan and Brenny, and 1st year for Jamie, Darcie, and Emmy."

Scott and his family dedicate their efforts to the memory of Jose Hernandez, who many of you remember. Jose was fascinated with Scotland and the Loch Ness Monster, and, through the Make-a-Wish Foundation, he and is family travelled to Scotland, and the Scottish Society of Tidewater adopted Jose as our "Nessie Ambassador." The Hernandez family attended several of our events, including the Tartan Day Ceilidh, and we all became very fond of them. Sadly, Jose lost his struggle against cancer in 2009. He was an extraordinary young man whose strength and bravery were inspirational, and we all miss him.


